The tri-tips were marinated and cooked by the Newport Beach Fire Department, and the lobsters were done perfectly under the supervision of Chief Dermot Driscoll and Marines from the 1st Battalion, 1st Marines at Camp Pendleton.

"Chris Szechenyi, general manager of the Five Crowns, chose an excellent set of wines from the Summerland Winery in Santa Barbara County," said Rotarian Laura Dietz. "The margaritas from Margaritaville and the beer from local brewery Dechutes were very, very popular as well."

"The catering staff of the Newport Dunes did a great job getting us set up and serving food to the VIP tables," Dietz said. "The audio needs of the event were handled by Al Newman. The auctioneer, Jim Nye, did a terrific job and introduced us all to a fundraising game called 'Heads or Tails' and the technique of auctioning off desserts."

"We should be extraordinarily proud of the steps we took toward increasing the profile of both our [Rotary] club as well as the Costa Mesa club," Brown said.
